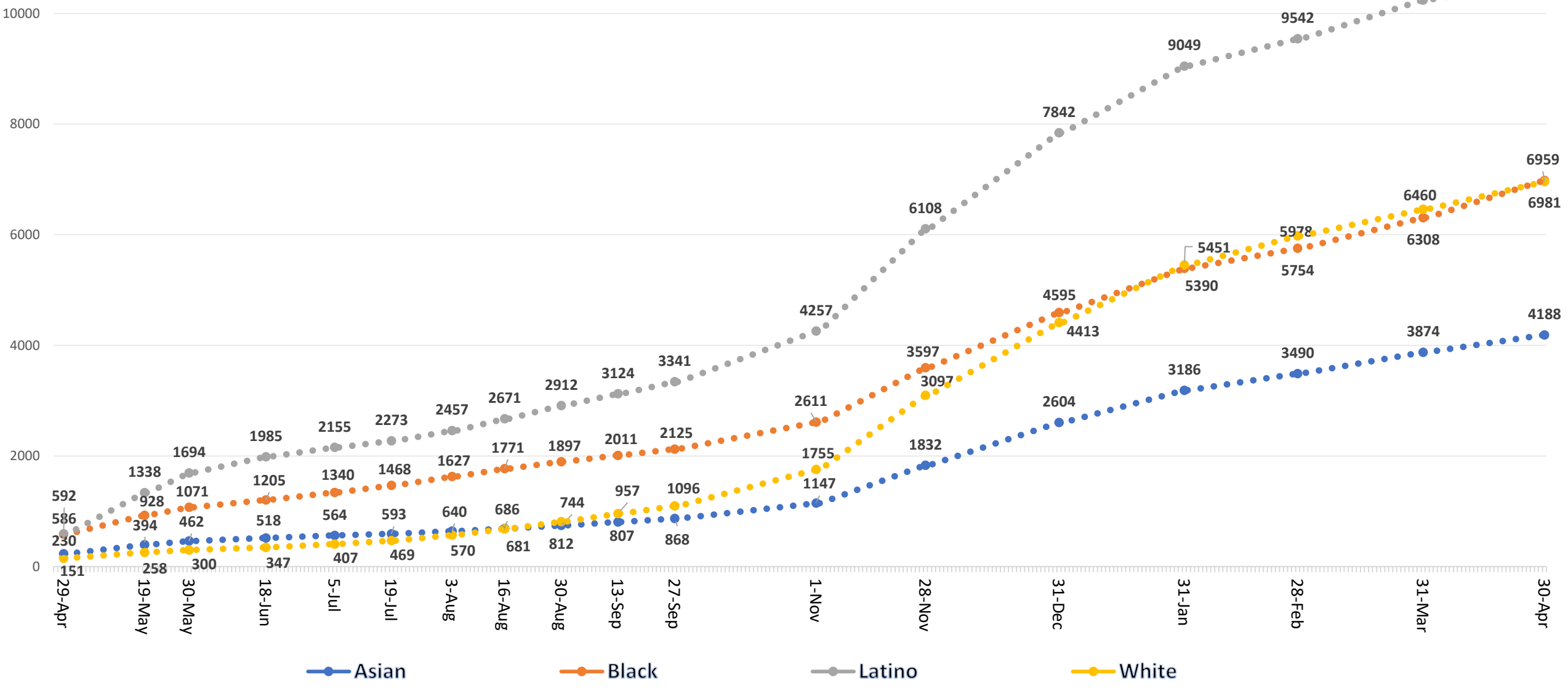


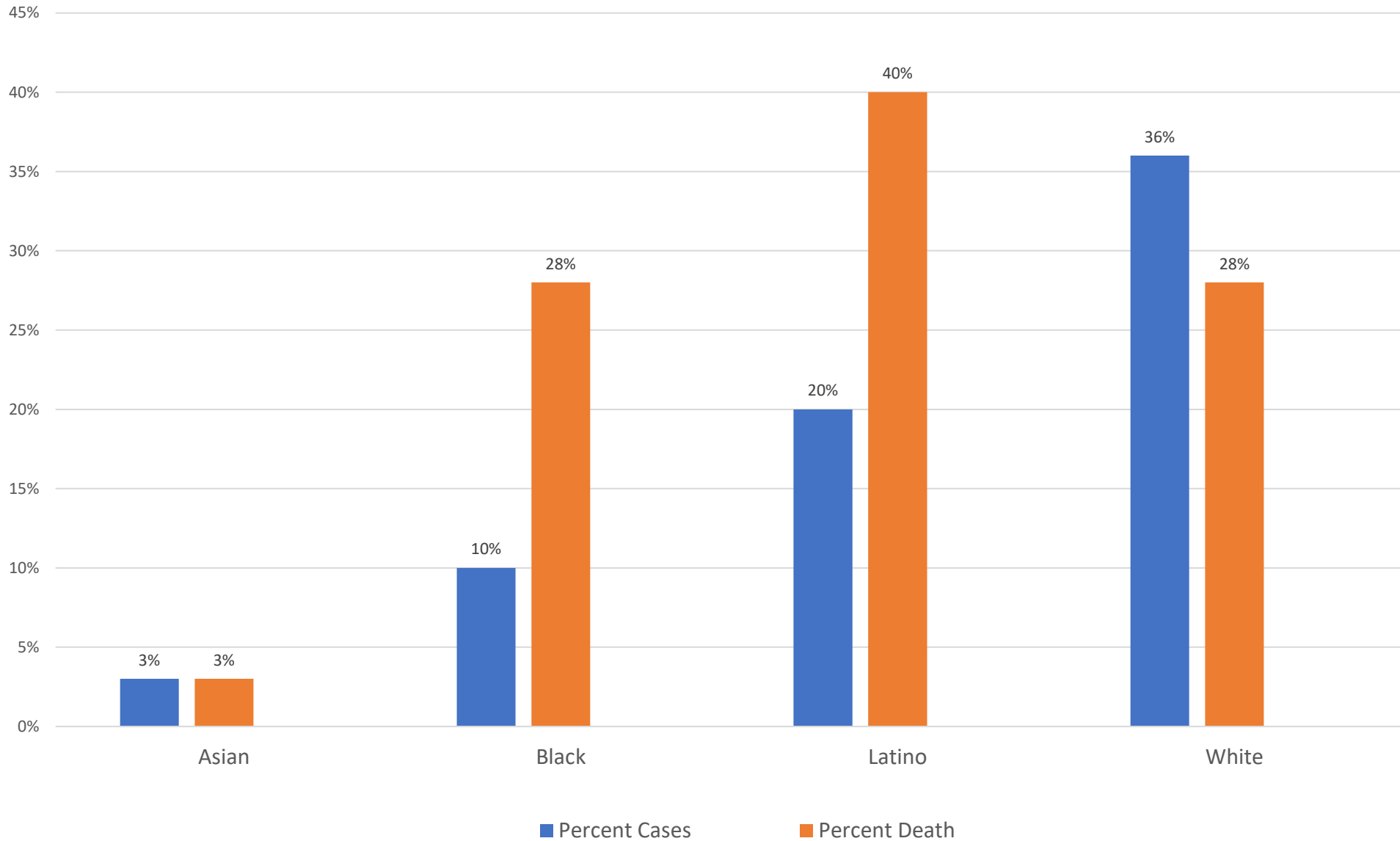


# Cases of COVID-19 per 100,000 Population for Select Races/Ethnicities, Apr. 29 2020 – Apr. 30 2021, Illinois



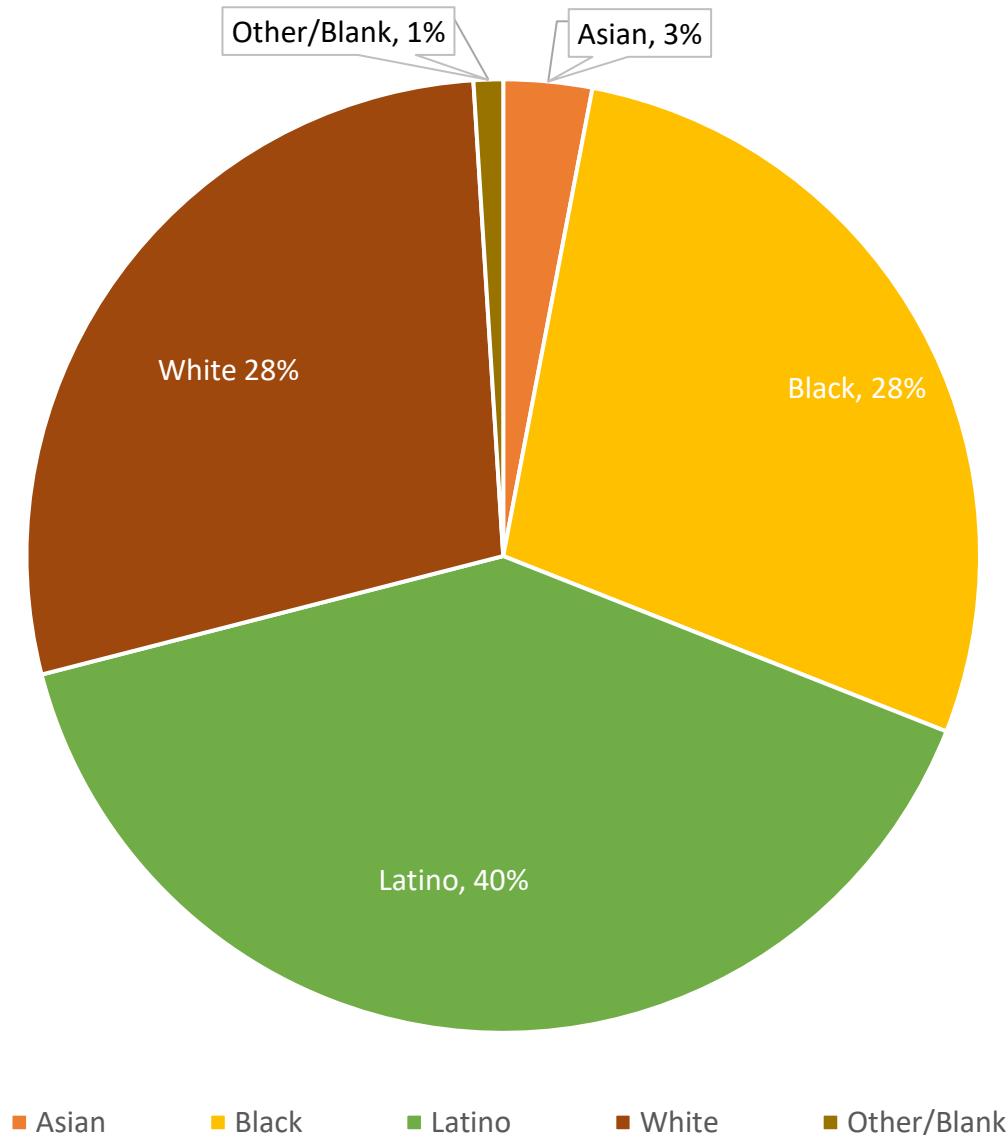

# In Illinois, the Percent of Cumulative COVID Cases and Percent of Cumulative COVID Deaths in Persons Aged 20-59 by Select Race/Ethnicity through May 1, 2021



Working-age Black and Latino people are dying at far greater rates relative to their case rates than working-age people of other racial-ethnic groups in Illinois.

# Cumulative COVID Deaths in Illinois among persons aged 20-59 years old by race and ethnicity, May 1, 2021



➤ Accounting for 40% of all deaths from COVID among those aged 20-59, Latinos have the highest percent of deaths from COVID in that age group.

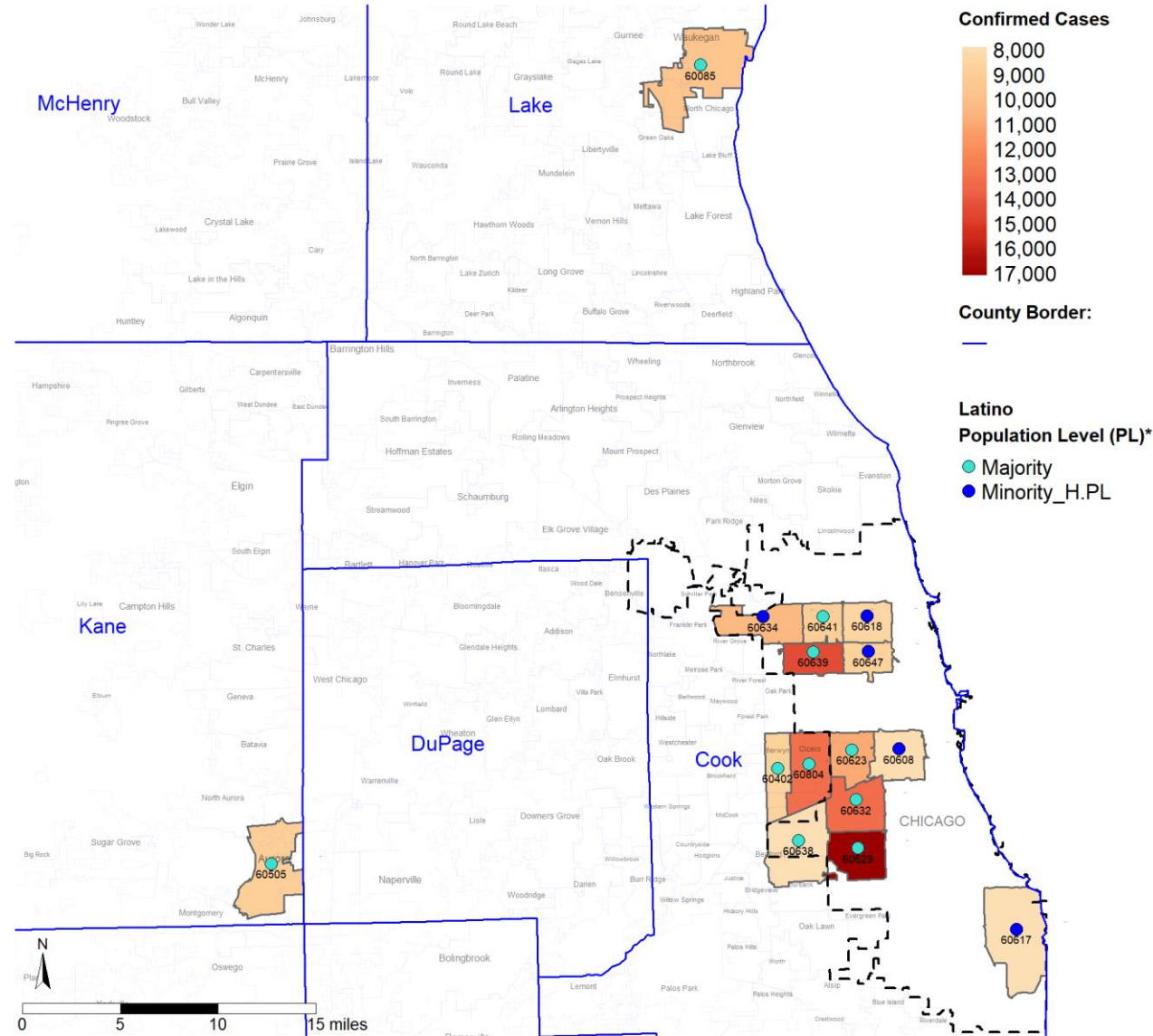

# Summary of Data



- Working-age Black and Latino people are dying at far greater rates relative to their case rates than working-age people of other racial-ethnic groups in Illinois.
- 70% of Latinos diagnosed with COVID are aged 20-59
- 2/3 of the 15 zip codes with the highest rates of diagnosed COVID cases have Latino majority populations
- As we continue to track the cumulative diagnosed case rates per 100,000, the Latino story changes very little. At 10,581 cases per 100,000, close to 11 percent of Illinois' Latino population is, or has been, diagnosed with COVID. This creates ongoing high social, economic, work force, and health care costs. Yet, even with consistently elevated rates of diagnosed COVID cases, the rates of testing among Latinos are lower than for any other racial or ethnic group and vaccine rates are far too low. Moreover, Latinos continue to be a dominant presence in high risk, albeit essential, jobs.
