Latino Policy Forum Statement on CPS Latino Advisory Committee

Chicago—February 11, 2014— Following a convening of 90 community leaders hosted by the Latino Policy Forum, Chicago Public Schools CEO Barbara Byrd-Bennet has commissioned the <u>district's first Latino Advisory Committee</u>; a move consistent with commitments <u>made last summer</u>.

"We're pleased it's finally happening," said Forum executive director Sylvia Puente. "We are taking this as a sign of good-faith that the district will implement the recommendations derived from this committee to create a long-overdue, equitable educational system that prepares Latino students for success."

Within Chicago Public Schools, Latinos now represent 44.3 percent of the student population, making up its largest cohort.

As a member of the taskforce, which is comprised of 13 civic and educational leaders, Puente conveyed an open-door policy to the greater Latino community in keeping the taskforce on track, "I value the feedback of teachers, parents and others working towards this common goal."
